

## Eligibility

- Participants in D.A.T.A. can be between the ages of 12 and 21
- Individuals are often referred by local magistrates, but they also can refer themselves
- In addition to magistrates, parents, health care professionals or agencies, school personnel, etc. can make referrals.

## Registration

## Program Curriculum

The D.A.T.A. program is designed as an educational intervention for adolescents who are considered to be in the early stages of alcohol and/or other drug abuse.

With that in mind, the goals are to provide accurate information regarding the abuse of mind-altering chemicals and the related consequences.

## Program Specifics

- Program duration is five weeks (one session a week)
- Participant must attend all five sessions to receive a letter of completion
- Parent(s) or guardian(s) participation required for the "Family Education" session
- Fee for D.A.T.A. program is \$125. (An additional cost of \$40 may be required for a drug screen at the time of the initial evaluation)
- Letter is sent to Magistrate, or other referral source as notification of "successful completion" of the course



**The goals of the D.A.T.A. program are to provide education and raise awareness of the nature of adolescent drug use and its associated risks.**

## Program Topics

- ✓ **Legal ramifications** related to alcohol and other drug use
- ✓ **Short-term effects** of alcohol and other drugs
- ✓ **Long-term effects** of alcohol and other drugs
- ✓ **Physical and psychological vulnerabilities** for dependence on mind altering chemicals
- ✓ **Risk-taking behavior** and its implications
- ✓ **Peer-pressure** issues
- ✓ **Decision making** skills
- ✓ **Impulse control** and delayed gratification issues
- ✓ **Coping skills** and strategies for avoiding continued chemical usage
- ✓ **Family education** on roles and responsibilities related to adolescent drug use
- ✓ **Prevention and intervention** strategies for parents
